Code of Conduct for Children

Aiki Kai Australia provides children of all skill levels the opportunity to learn the basic skills of Aikido in a safe and relaxed environment and in a non-competitive manner.

We have a strict code of conduct, which includes:

- 1. Respect of fellow Aikido students and instructors
- 2. Aikido is to be practiced only under the supervision of an instructor
- 3. Aikido is never to be used as a way of molesting or harming others
- 4. Bullying, fighting or swearing are unacceptable behaviours of an Aikido student

Any student who continually breaks these rules may be asked to leave the dojo.

We request that all children are collected **promptly** at the end of class for their own safety and respect to the instructor and other students.

Under no circumstances will instructors administer any form of medication to students. If an accident occurs, Aiki Kai Australia has clearly defined procedures on how to manage this (see www.aikido.org.au/forms.html#MemberProtectionpolicy). The instructor will always try to inform the parents or custodians of the children immediately. Parents and custodians must ensure that instructors have the most up-to-date contact details including phone and mobile phone numbers.
